OIS is an IB World School offering the PYP, MYP and Diploma programmes, and is accredited by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC). OIS enjoys a strong reputation for its academic programme, and with its unique relationship with its sister school, offers an outstanding music, sports and visual arts extra-curricular programme. Because of the relationship with the sister school the music program actually draws on a much larger student body for its classes and ensembles.
